with State Senator Troy Singleton

State Senator Troy Singleton has made civic engagement a priority during his time in the NJ Assembly and Senate. In addition to hosting monthly Citizen Advisory Panel meetings, he solicits feedback on important policy initiatives from his “bosses” (constituents) through weekly blog posts and social media. He also hosts monthly service events throughout his legislative district called “Serve with Senator Singleton” in which he encourages folks to join him volunteering on a local community service initiative. To extend civic engagement to his youngest “bosses,” the Senator has authored legislation, S3174, which would require civics instruction in middle and high schools.

Senator Singleton began his career as Legislative Director for NJ Assemblymen Herb Conaway and Jack Conners in the district he would later come to represent. He then served as Deputy Executive Director of the NJ General Assembly Majority Office and Chief of Staff for highly respected Assembly Speaker Joseph J. Roberts, Jr.

In 2011, he was elected to his first term in the NJ General Assembly, representing the 7th Legislative District and was elected to the NJ State Senate in 2017. He currently serves as Chair of the Senate Community and Urban Affairs Committee, Vice Chair of the Senate Economic Growth Committee, and as a member of both the Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee and the Judiciary Committee.

Senator Singleton’s primary focus has been on job creation, economic development, domestic violence prevention and expanding educational opportunities for children. He has received numerous awards for public service and legislative acumen from business, education, civic, labor and non-profit organizations.

Senator Singleton considers community involvement as an essential component of his life. He has served as Rowan University trustee, board member of the Boys & Girls Club of Camden County, NJ Council for the Humanities, Burlington County Library Foundation, and the Garden States Arts Foundation. He also served as Commissioner of the NJ Turnpike Authority and currently serves as Commissioner on the Burlington County Bridge Commission, Co-Chair of New Leaders Council NJ, and Advisory Board member for Habitat for Humanity of Burlington County and Greater Trenton-Princeton.
