Can You Help Them Win by Making a Financial Contribution now?

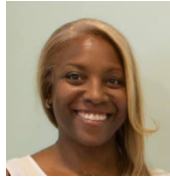

Lori Faye, Candidate for Lumberton Township Committee

Lori says, "My decision to seek re-election stems from a desire to continue the work of keeping Lumberton, a town that has provided me and my family with such a positive quality of life, a great place to live. Our town continues to grow and face important decisions about the future. I remain committed to engaging with residents, actively listening to their concerns, and cultivating positive relationships with neighboring communities and county officials in support of initiatives that can improve our quality of life. Despite challenges to social norms and values in politics, I still believe there is more that unites us than divides us. I will always support people over party and

In 2022 I became the first Democrat elected to the Township Committee in 30 years by 16 votes! During my term I formed a Green Team, securing over \$25,000 in grants for the town. I have served to improve transparency and opposed additional warehouse development. If re-elected, I will continue to make myself

available to residents and continue to use the Green Team to steer Hainesport towards more sustainable practices."

My strategy is simple but powerful: connect with neighbors, earn their trust, and show them that

we will work tirelessly to make Hainesport a welcoming, forward-thinking community for all."
